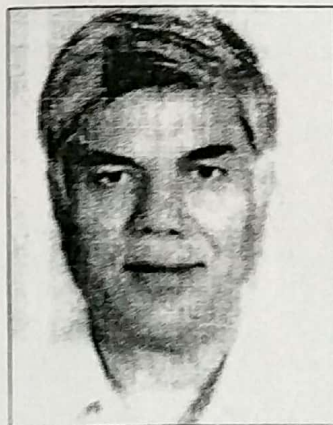

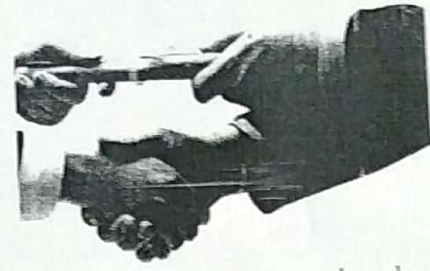

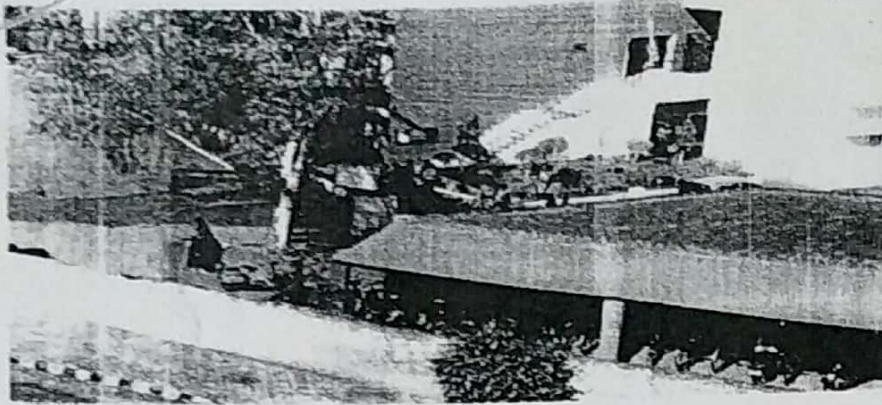

block and a complete computer centre, consisting of a Computer Room, Teaching room and office.

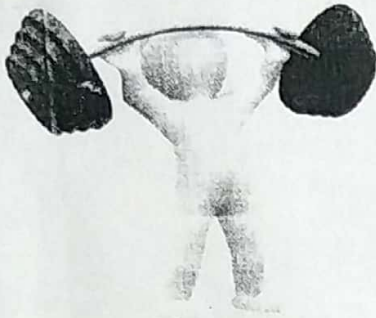

Important Instructions :

1. The students of B.A. Part-I class are allowed to change combination of subjects or faculty within a period of 1 Month from the date of admission by paying Rs. 50/- per subject and Rs. 200/- respectively.
2. No candidate for B.A. Part-I examination (under new scheme +3) shall take up the subject of Mathematics if he has not opted this subject in +2 examination.
3. The students who have passed the examination of Punjabi Parbath from Languages Department Punjab will be considered equivalent to Matric Punjabi & will be eligible for the concerned course if they fulfil the rest of the conditions.



Regarding Taking Subject Punjabi Mudhla Gyan in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.

1. The following categories of candidates shall be allowed to opt for the paper of Punjabi Mudhla Gyan in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. & other related courses.
 - (a) Candidates who passed their Matriculation or 10+2 Examination from the schools/Institutions situated outside the state of Punjab.
 - (b) Children of Defence Personnel /Para-Military Personnel, the father or mother (guardian (in case the father of the candidate is deceased) will give a declaration that the candidate has not studied in Punjab at the School level.

Eligibility:

The Student should have passed B.A. Part-I examination (New Scheme) of Punjab University.

Note:

1. Every candidate shall take up the same combination of subjects as taken up by him/her in B.A. Part-I
2. A candidate who has been declared to reappear in not more than one subject in Part-I examination of this university or Panjab University is eligible to join Part II but such a candidate shall have to clear the reappear paper in the supplementary examination of the same year or simultaneously with Part-II examination failing which his/her result of part-II examination shall also stand cancelled.
3. A student who has passed B.A. Part-I from other University (GNLU & Panjab University) is eligible to take admission in Part-II.
4. A student who has opted for English Lit. in B.A.-I, can opt for Honours in English in B.A.-IIInd year.

B.A. Part-III (Annual System)

Eligibility

The Students should have passed B.A. Part-II examination (New Scheme) of Punjabi University. If a candidate has been declared to reappear in one subject in Part II examination of this University or Panjab University or Guru Nanak Dev University, he/she will also be eligible, but such a candidate shall have to clear the reappear paper in the supplementary examination failing which his/her result of Part III shall also stand cancelled.

Every Candidate shall take up the same combination of subjects as taken up by him/her in B.A. Part-II.

ADMISSION COUNSELLING

1. All admission for B.A. B.Sc./B.Com/B.C.A./B.B.A, M.A. (Hrs.), M.Bel. (P), M.Bel. (Maths), M.A. (English), M.Com & Other courses shall be provisional subject to approval/confirmation of admission by Punjabi University. The College shall not be responsible if university does not approve admission of any student due to wrong or incomplete particulars submitted by him/her or for want of any requisite document. Therefore before filling in the form the candidate must ensure that he/she is eligible for admission to particular class. If any ineligibility is detected at any stage, the admission shall be cancelled and college shall not be responsible in any case.
2. Principal reserve the right to refuse admission to any students whose behaviour was not found up to mark in the previous class.
3. Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
4. The Principal can cancel the admission of any student who has been admitted to the college without assigning any reason what so ever.



General Rules for Admission & Reservation of Seats

1. Every Candidate seeking admission to the college shall possess a copy of the College Prospectus including the Admission Form, available from the College Office on payment of Rs. 250/- (Rs. 275/- by Post)
2. Every Candidate must complete the admission form in all respects along with attested copies of supporting certificates and two passport size photographs.
3. Every student is required to produce in original the university/Board Certificate of having passed the Previous Examination and a character certificate from the institution last attended.
4. Those who are already registered with the Board/University must produce their registration card at the time of admission.
5. In case any result is declared late by the University, a student can seek admission without late fee within 10 working days of the date of declaration of the result, subject to the availability of seats in that class.
6. A student belonging to scheduled or backward class is required to fill the necessary stipend form subject to income limits (Rs. 1,000,00/- p.a. for S.C. and Rs. 2,50,000/- p.a. for BC.) He/She will have to produce a certificate as proof of his/her belonging to the class concerned along with the income certificate from the competent authority.
7. a) Students from any other University/Board are required to furnish the original marks certificate of previous examination passed.
b) Students passing their lower examination from other University/Board are required to obtain and produce eligibility certificate issued by Punjabi University, Patiala

GENERAL RULES & RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of Seats

A) According to the Punjab Government Letter No. 389 (S)-99/7/87.c. (Edu) 3 dated 14.7.87 seats have been reserved for various categories of candidates as under :

- B) On the recommendation of HRD Ministry, UGC has directed the Universities and their affiliated college to provide a minimum of 5% seats for foreign students in various courses.
- C) Wherever minimum percentage of marks is prescribed for admission to a particular class, a relaxation of 5% will be allowed in the case of scheduled castes/backward class candidates.

IMPORTANT

- (a) As per Punjabi University rules, one seat up to 50 students in a class and two seats having more than 50 students (Maximum Six in a college) will be reserved at entry point for the students on the basis of their performance in University Youth Festivals. The students applying against this Category shall be interviewed by the committee constituted by the Principal for this purpose.
- (b) 10% additional seats in each class/course shall be reserved at entry point for poor & intelligent rural candidates. The list of such students shall be supplied by D.C. Office & the students seeking admission against this category shall be interviewed by the Principal of the concerned college and the university representative. Such students shall have to fulfil eligibility conditions.
- (i) Students who have been detained/disqualified/failed in the same class will not be eligible to apply under this category.
- (ii) Certificate of good conduct from the Principal of the institution last attended shall have to be submitted along with the application form.
- (iii) These students shall have to secure minimum 60% marks in qualifying entrance test where ever applicable.
- (iv) The students getting admission under this category will be entitled to fee and other concession as per the policy of the Punjab Govt./Punjabi University.

Admission To Re-Evaluation Cases :

A student whose result is declared late on account of re-evaluation can seek admission within 10 working days after the declaration of result subject to availability of seats.

Eligibility for University Examination**House Examination & Attendance for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Part I, II, III students**

To be eligible for Annual Examinations :

- i) (a) For the students of B.A.-1st year, all other Graduation Courses and Post Graduation Courses eligibility conditions for appearing in exams will be as per Punjabi University Norms.

For Students of B.A.-IInd & IIIrd year (Annual System)

- i) (a) A student should have obtained 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects or 20% in each subject in the house examination held by the College.
 (b) Special Test : 35% marks in each subject.
 ii) A student must have attended at least 66% of the total lectures/practicals/tutorials in each subject (provided that at least 75% of the lectures/practicals/tutorials fixed for the subject have been delivered.) For genuine reason the Principal is empowered to condone shortage in attendance up to 15 periods in lectures, 7 Periods in tutorials (Comm. Classes) in every subject provided that no condonation is allowed if the candidate has not attended 50% of the total lectures/ practicals/tutorials delivered/ conducted in each subject.

Note : Under the Punjabi University regulations, students who do not fulfil the above conditions cannot appear in the Annual examination even as 'Private Candidates'

Payment of Fees**Fees & Funds****Common for all Students**

The applicant must study the fee-structure before signing and submitting application for admission to a course. Fees and funds once paid will not be refunded in any case even though a student has not attended college for a single day. The college is not bound by any remedial claim, incidental or consequential, express or implied, accruing from fee, funds and other tariffs.

1. The security will be refunded in the month of November in the next session.
2. Security Not withdrawn up to 30th June of the following session shall lapse automatically.
3. All students coming on bicycles/scooters/motor cycles shall have to pay cycle/motor cycle fee for the entire session. Any student found evading the payment of fee will be charged double the normal fee.
4. If any student leaves the college without completing his/her class/course, he/she shall have no claim whatsoever for the refund of fee.
5. Any enhancement in fee and funds by the Pbi. University/Pb. Govt. Managing Committee/College authorities at any stage shall be binding on the students of all classes. The proposed revised fee structure, if any, will be notified to the students.

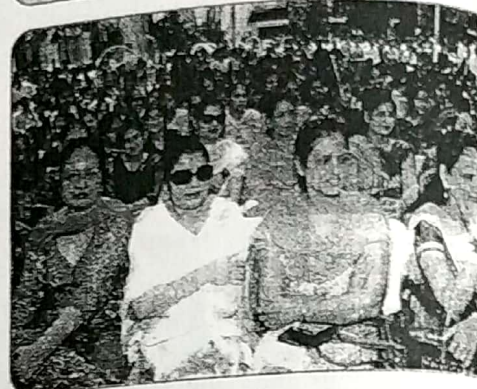

- Charges of absence per day will be Rs. 5/- in addition to the absentee fine prescribed by the university.

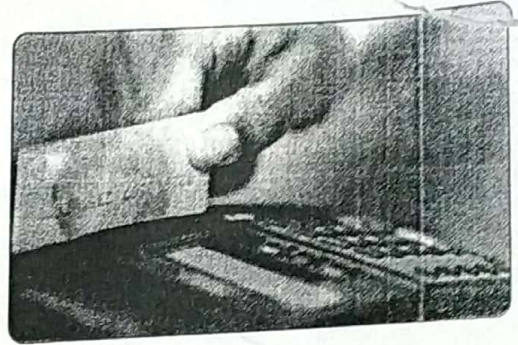

Rules for Payment of Dues

1. Re-appear students of B.A. I/B.Sc.I/B.Com. I will pay full fee at the time of admission.
2. Dues will be accepted only in cash. Cheques and bank drafts will not be accepted. Fee once paid will not be refunded.
4. If a science/computer student changes his/her subjects to Arts, the Science/computer fee previously paid by him/her will neither be refunded, nor adjusted.
5. If a student leaves the college during any of the above mentioned terms, he will have to pay fees for the whole period of that term, except in case of migration.
6. A student whose name is struck off on account of non-payment of dues may be readmitted on payment of the pending dues and re-admission fee.
7. A student absent or on leave from the college must arrange to pay his/her fee on the due date.

Fee Concession

1. Application for the concession on prescribed form obtainable from the college for Rs. 1/- should be submitted when called for.
2. A student applying for fee concession should attach with his/her application form a certificate from the Head of the institution last attended that he/she enjoyed concession there.
3. Fee concession, stipend, scholarship etc. will be withdrawn in case a scholar deteriorates in studies, remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of unfair means in any house test or examination.

Special Concession

The Government has decided to extend educational concessions offered to the children of officers and men of the Armed Forces killed or permanently disabled during Indo-Pak and Indo-China conflicts, to the children of Defence Personnel, of Indian Peace-Keeping Force in Srilanka who have been killed or wounded. These concessions include complete exemption from tuition and other fees, full cost of books and stationery etc.

Facility for free education will be available to the children of sufferers of certain categories as per Punjab Govt. Letter No. 19/2/87-EDU-1386-92 dated 30.04.90

RULES & REGULATIONS

Regulations Leave Rules

1. Leave for absence from the College should be applied for when absolutely necessary.
2. Leave should be secured personally before it is availed of. In case of serious illness, the leave application should be submitted immediately on returning to the college.
3. Leave application should be signed by the applicant's father/guardian.
4. A Medical certificate should be attached with the leave application in case of long illness.
5. Leave up to 6 days will be granted by the teacher incharge of various classes and for a period of more than 6 days by the Principal.

Rules for Sportsmen

1. No student shall be allowed to get himself registered with any club or team outside the college & play against the college. All sports activities in the college will be organized under college auspices only.
2. According to the University rules, the players will be permitted to participate in the University Tournaments only when they have attended at least 50% lectures in each subject from the date of admission in the college to the date of commencement of the tournament.
3. Sportsmen are expected to show exemplary behaviour and maintain discipline in the college. If a sportsman is found guilty of misbehaviour or breach of discipline inside or outside the college, he will be removed from the rolls of the college and all concessions given to him will be withdrawn with retrospective effect.
4. Players should be regular in attendance in their classes and maintain steady progress in studies. Their admission form will not be sent up for the University Examination if they fall short of lectures or fail to qualify in the House examinations according to the University Rules.



Rules of House Examination

1. The college will hold house examination as per Punjabi University rules. In addition to this class tests may be held.
2. It is compulsory for all students to appear in the House Examinations, and Tests. The absentees will be fined/detained according to rules.
3. The Examinees should be punctual. Late comers will be treated as absent from the examination.
4. Absence from examination for any reason will mean nil performance which may result in detention of a candidate from University examinations.
5. Leave from an Examination or test should be secured from the Principal well in time. No such application will be entertained after the Examination is over.
6. Leave from an Examination or test should be secured separately on prescribed form obtainable from the college office.
7. When a student falls ill, he should send his application for leave from the examination to the Principal immediately. The application should be supported by a medical certificate.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

8. Students are expected to extend all co-operation to the supervisory staff and advised not to use unfair means in the house examination. Any student found guilty of misbehavior or using unfair means during the examinations will be awarded a deterrent punishment which may amount to expulsion/rustication from the college.
9. The scholars winning top position in the House Examinations in various classes will be awarded certificates of merit by the Principal.

Career Counselling and Placement Cell :

The college has a Career Counselling and Placement Cell. Students of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A II & III are required to join as Members of the CCPC by paying an yearly subscription of Rs. 200/- The CCP Cell will provide them expert guidance regarding their career prospects and also work for their placement in jobs suitable to their calibre.

The CCP Cell has already succeeded in the placement of more than 200 students of this college from various faculties. Nine students of this college were selected by a Medical Company from Chennai during its campus interview Programme last month.

The CCP Cell proposes to organize various seminars on the job prospects and also invite experts in various fields. We have listed more than 50 firms of national and international repute. We hope to help our graduates for their placement in Multi National Companies.

For this job, what the students need is proper outlook and aptitude. The CCP Cell will also organize Personality Development and Orientation Programme for providing an edge to the intelligence of the students so that they are easily absorbed in the job market.



Extra-Curricular Activities

Gainful activities outside the class room play a significant role in shaping the overall personality of a scholar. The aim of the college in organizing extra-curricular activities is to impart a sense of responsibility to the youth. All extra-curricular activities other than those organized under the N.C.C. and N.S.S. will be organized and co-ordinated by the youth welfare department of college.

A number of subject societies, associations and clubs actively function in the college. These societies organize very useful extra-curricular activities, such as lectures by eminent scholars, Inter college declamation and paper reading contests, debates, poetical symposia, variety shows etc.

National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.)

1. Facilities for N.C.C. training, parades and camps are available for those who voluntarily take up N.C.C.
2. Students get ample opportunities to attend training camps and specialized camps like advanced leadership, mountaineering and other inter state camps. N.C.C. Cadets are trained for 'B' and 'C' Certificate exam. Students holding 'C' certificate are given priority in selection as an officer in Army, Air Force, Navy and Police, Students holding 'B' and 'C' certificate are given incentives and additional marks in various professional and higher classes for getting admission.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

National Service Scheme (N.S.S.)

The College has three units for boys and girls under the control of Punjabi University, Patiala. The scheme is aimed at familiarizing the Youth with the environment of our community and its needs. It inculcates in students the spirit of placing service before self and the country above all.

The membership of the scheme is voluntary but it is desirable that more and more students should enroll themselves in the scheme. **Distinguished N.S.S. Volunteers are given incentives and additional marks in various professional and higher classes for getting admission.**



Sports Council

All sports activities are organized by the Sports Council constituted as under

1. Chairman (Principal)
2. Faculty members Nominated by the Principal as presidents of various games.
3. Captains of Various games.
4. Secretary (Lecturer in Phy. Education)

The outstanding sportsmen with a clean past career are given due consideration at the time of their admission to the college. Deserving scholars may be given fee concession and other facilities in keeping with their talent in sports.

Scheme for SC/ST Candidates

Conditions for eligibility to get financial help / aid from the Government as communicated by the D.P.I. for scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, backward classes and low income group students is as under:

Note: Students belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, Backward classes and low income groups studying in college and universities are eligible to get financial aid from the Government under following schemes:

1. Govt. of India Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme

Scheduled Caste students who are permanent resident of Punjab and are studying anywhere in India for Post-Matric education will be given scholarship under this scheme provided that total annual income of the entire family from all sources does not exceed Rs. 24,000/-

2. State Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme

Students studying in Punjab State or Chandigarh (U.T) recognized evening college, belonging to scheduled castes and who are permanent residents of Punjab and are whole time employees of Punjab Government, Punjab State electricity Board, State Controlled Corporations Institution, University employees will be given scholarship under this scheme provided that the annual income of such students including the income of the family concerned does exceed Rs. 1,00,000/-

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

3. STATE HARIJAN WELFARE SCHEME

Student Studying in Punjab State College/Institutions who are Permanent residents of Punjab belonging to Backward Class will be given stipend under the scheme provided that the total annual income of the family does not exceed Rs. 44, 500/- under this scheme. Stipends are also paid to scheduled caste candidates. If the total income of the family is up to Rs. 1,00,000/-

4. SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR SCHEDULED TRIBES

Students of scheduled tribes who are permanent residents of Punjab and are studying in Punjab or Chandigarh college will be given scholarship provided that the total income of the family does not exceed Rs. 5000/- and the total annual land revenue paid should not exceed Rs. 1000/-

5. SPECIAL GRANT TO GIRLS BELONGING TO SCHEDULED CASTES

Girls belonging to scheduled caste whose parents/guardians are permanent residents of Punjab and who are studying in Punjab and Chandigarh colleges will be given special grant for studies provided that total annual income of the family does not exceed Rs. 60,965/- subject to release of grant by state govt.

6. LOW INCOME GROUP SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

Under this scheme students not belonging to scheduled castes, backward classes, scheduled tribes will be given scholarship provided that the total annual income of their parents does not exceed Rs. 24000/-. **It is to be noted that applications for all type of scholarships etc. will have to be sent to the Director of Public Instructions (C) Punjab, Chandigarh by 31st December every year.**

Free ship is given to scheduled caste, scheduled tribe and backward class students whose parent's income does not exceed Rs. 24000/- per annum and who have not failed more than once in the preceding class.

7. POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS BELONGING TO THE MINORITY COMMUNITIES

Students belonging to Minority communities whose parents income is upto 2 Lac. per year and who have scored minimum 50% marks in the previous class can avail of this scholarship.
