

Warm Greetings to all! Going through an unprecedented global predicament of COVID-19, I express my solidarity with you and your family.



4. Attach following documents with admission form
  - i) Passport size photographs = two (1 is to be pasted on form, 1 to be stapled)
  - ii) 1 Stamp size photograph (To be pasted on ID card)
  - iii) Character Certificate from institution last attended (not required for old students)
  - iv) Attested copy of last exam passed.
5. Students from any other University/Board are required to furnish the original detailed marks certificate of previous examination passed.
6. Students passing their lower examination from other University/Board are required to obtain & produce Eligibility Certificate issued by Punjabi University, Patiala. They are also required to obtain Migration Certificate from their previous University/Board.
7. Please attach attested copies of reserved category certificate, if any.
8. If admission is granted, deposit the fees at appropriate fee counter on the same day.
9. **Students are required to fill subjects of their respective course in the form, if university changes any subject during the session students have to opt accordingly.**

## IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS :

1. The students of B.A. Part-I are allowed to change combination of subjects or faculty within a period of one month from the date of admission by paying Rs. 50/- and Rs. 200/- respectively. Students of BBA/BCA/B.Sc./B.Com can also change their faculty at first entry level within stipulated time.
2. No candidate for B.A. Part-I examination (under new scheme +3) shall take up the subject of Mathematics if he has not opted for this subject in +2 examination.
3. The students who have passed the examination of Punjabi Parbodh from Languages Department Punjab will be considered equivalent to Matric Punjabi & will be eligible for the concerned course if they fulfill the rest of the conditions.

### **Punjabi Lazmi Mudla Gyan in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory shall be allowed to the following categories of Candidates**

Candidate who have passed their matriculation examination from a school located outside the state of Punjab or an Examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

1. Candidates who have passed their matriculation examination from a school located in the state of Punjab will not be allowed to take up the subject of Punjabi Lazmi (Mudla Gyan) in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory at the Graduate level.
2. Children of Defence personnel / Para Military personnel (Serving as well as retired) will be allowed to take up the subject of Punjabi Lazmi (Mudla Gyan) provided the father or the mother/guardian (in case father is deceased) of the candidate gives an affidavit that the candidate has not studied Punjabi at the school level.

**As per instructions of Punjabi University vide its letter No. 5163-5308/G.C.-6, dt. 13-05-08 all students of B.A., B.Com. & B.Sc. shall have to study Punjabi in all three years of their respective degree courses.**

### B.A. Part-I (Semester System)

#### Course Objective:-

After completing the course a student can appear in any competitive exam, pursue for higher studies or get placement in Banking, Insurance Sector, Teaching etc.

#### Eligibility:

1. The candidate must have passed SSC-II, examination of the School Education Board of Punjab, Haryana, H.P., C.B.S.E. or any other examination recognized by Punjabi University as equivalent thereto.
2. Students with a reappear in +2 exam can seek admission provided, he/she clears exam within the schedule time of admission with late fees applicable at the time according to admission schedule.

2. English (Communication Skills)

**Drug Abuse Problem, Management & Prevention:** As per order of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court students have to appear in a paper : Drug Abuse Problem, Management & Prevention in second semester of B.A., B.B.A, B.Com. B.Sc. & B.C.A.

#### **Note :**

1. Every candidate shall take up the same combination of subjects as taken up by him/her in B.A. Part-I
2. A student who has passed B.A. Part-I from other University (GNDU & Panjab University) is eligible to take admission in Part-II.
3. A student who has opted for English Literature in B.A.-I, can opt for Honours in English in B.A.-IInd year.

### **ENVIRONMENT STUDIES & ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS**

As per instructions of Punjabi University the paper of ENVIRONMENT STUDIES & ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS will be conducted in the third semester of B.A., B.B.A., B.Com, B.Com (H), B.Sc. and B.C.A.

### **B.A. Part-III** (Semester System)

#### **Eligibility**

Students should have passed at least 50% papers of previous four semester exams.

**Note:** Every candidate shall take up the same combination of subjects as taken up by him/her in B.A. Part-II.

### **B.Com. Part-I** (Semester System)

#### **Eligibility**

The following students are eligible to get admission in B.Com. 1st Year.

1. Student should have passed +2 examination of PSEB or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with at least:
  - (a) 40% marks in aggregate in case of students who have passed +2 commerce group.
  - (b) 45% marks in aggregate in case of students who have passed +2 humanities group with at least two subjects out of Commerce / Accounts/ Maths/ Economics/ Management papers.
  - (c) 50% marks in aggregate in case of students who have passed +2 not covered under (a) & (b) category.

# Conditions For Admission


1. All admission for all graduation and post graduation classes & Other courses shall be provisional subject to approval/confirmation of admission by Punjabi University. The College shall not be responsible if university does not approve admission of any student due to wrong or incomplete particulars submitted by him/her or for want of any requisite document. Therefore before filling in the form, the candidate must ensure that he/she is eligible for admission to a particular class. If any ineligibility is detected at any stage, the admission shall be cancelled and college shall not be responsible in any case.
2. **The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student whose behaviour was not found up to mark in the previous class.**
3. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
4. The Principal can cancel the admission of any student who has been admitted to the college without assigning any reason whatsoever.
5. Students will keep their mobile phones on silent mode in campus and no mobile phone is allowed in campus during examination.

## GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION & RESERVATION OF SEATS

1. Every Candidate seeking admission to the college shall possess a copy of the College Prospectus including the Admission Form, available from the College Office on payment of Rs. 250/- (Rs. 275/- by Post)
2. Every Candidate must complete the admission form in all respects along with attested copies of supporting certificates and two passport size photographs.
3. Every student is required to produce in original the university/Board Certificate of having passed the Previous Examination and a character certificate from the institution last attended.

### **MOST IMPORTANT**

4. **a) Students from any other University/Board are required to furnish the original marks certificate of previous examination passed along with migration certificate in the college office for verification by the university within 15 days of getting admission.**  
**b) Students passing their lower examination from other University/Board are required to obtain and produce eligibility certificate issued by Punjabi University, Patiala to get admission in the college.**



## ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

### House Examination & Attendance for Graduation & Post Graduation Students.

To be eligible for Examinations :

- i) (a) For the students of all Graduation Courses and Post Graduation Courses eligibility conditions for appearing in exams will be as per Punjabi University Norms.
- (b) A student should have obtained marks according to university rules in house test.
- ii) A student must have attended at least 75% of the total lectures/practicals/tutorials in each subject. For genuine reason the Principal is empowered to condone shortage in attendance according to university norms. The Principal has right to detain the roll number of students according to university norms if he/she does not fulfil norms of attendance and marks in house tests.

**Note :** Under the Punjabi University regulations, students who do not fulfil the above conditions, cannot appear in the examination.

## PAYMENT OF FEES & FUNDS

### Common for all Students

The applicant must study the fee-structure before signing and submitting application for admission to a course.

1. The security will be refunded in the month of November in the next session.
2. Security not withdrawn up to 30th June of the following session shall lapse automatically.
3. All students coming on scooters/motorcycles shall have to pay motorcycle fee for the entire session. Any student found evading the payment of fee will be charged double the normal fee.

## E-MODULE: LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

**Vision:** To facilitate our students with the best of the teaching-learning technology.

E-Module has been designed for providing e-contents related to syllabi of various courses running in college. E-contents refer to the files or data in the following formats: ppt, pdf, doc, avi, MP4, etc. This user friendly module uses the Google-Classroom facility and it can be accessed by our students and faculty-members from their mobile phones and PCs. The e-classes for each department have been created which are further subdivided for each teacher of the respective department. Teachers can contribute in this module by using their gmail-id. What is Google Classroom? It is a free service for institutions and non-profit organizations offered under the Google for Education scheme. It uses cloud computing technique and facilitates online teacher-student interactions and distribution of learning material, assignments, quizzes, etc. How to use it? For Students: Students can access the e-module using Google Classroom App on their android mobile phones. The student's gmail account is essential for accessing it. Student can join his/her respective departments through the assigned CLASS CODES\*. A student can join any number of departments. On the other hand, this facility can also be accessed from the student's email account directly on the personal computer by selecting the Google-Classroom app from its menu (placed at the top right corner of the web browser). For Teachers: For organized form of the e-contents, all departments have been assigned a separate platform (classroom), which is further divided into topics on the name of teachers of that department. A teacher can invite (add) or remove any number of teachers and students in the department. For this the, teacher has to send an invitation from the respective gmail account. The contents contributed by a teacher will be shown under his/her name in the department if while uploading he/she select the topic as required name. To create the index of uploaded contents on this portal, each department has been provided topic 'Index for Teachers' at the top in Classwork. Teachers are requested to fill it for keeping the record and quick access of the uploaded contents.

**Benefits:** It enables students to download and revise the teaching material related to their courses. ## SCHEME OF POST-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO THE SC/BC STUDENTS

The following guidelines have been issued by the Government to Students who want to apply for scholarship. For more information please visit <http://punjab scholarship.gov.in>

The scholarship under this category will be as per the following guidelines/conditions issued by Punjab Govt.

- Minimum 75% attendance of student is compulsory in semester/annual.
- Annual income of whose parents/guardian from all sources does not exceed Rs.2.50 lakh for SC students.
- Annual income of whose parents/guardian from all sources does not exceed Rs.1.00 lakh for BC students.
- A scholarship holder under this scheme will not avail any other scholarship/stipend for pursuing the course.
- Students of SC category will deposit their college fee in full and they will get reimbursement from the Punjab Govt as and when the scholarship grant is released to the beneficiaries.
- To be eligible for this scholarship, caste certificate, Aadhar card, Bank account and income certificate is must.

The Government has decided to extend educational concessions offered to the children of officers and men of the armed forces killed or permanently disabled during Indo-Pak and Indo-China conflicts, to the children of Defence Personnel and of Indian Peace-Keeping Force in Srilanka who have been killed or wounded. These concessions include complete exemption from tuition and other fees, full cost of books and stationery etc. Facility for free education will be available to the children of sufferers of certain categories as per Punjab Govt. Letter No. 19/2/87-EDU-1386-92 dated 30.04.90

### Fee for SC students eligible for Post Matric Scholarship.

Instructions from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, New Delhi vide letter No. 14011/01/2018-SCD-V dated 11.7.2018 circulated vide Govt of Punjab, Department of Higher Education letter No. 7/6/2018-5Edu1/1273956/1-6 dated 17.7.2018 and Punjabi University Endst.No. 2234-College/GC/5 dated 25.4.2019

"If a SC student is found eligible for scholarship, the date for depositing the fee of such SC student may be extended till scholarship amount is transferred to his/her account. In all such cases, if so required, institution may take in assurance from such students that they will deposit the fee to the institution as soon as they receive the scholarship amount in their accounts.

Furthermore, it is reported that some of the students have missed or failed to get admission because of delay in issue of these instructions, the Universities/Institutions may consider to extend the date for admissions".

In the light of above, the College has decided not to charge any fee from SC students eligible for Post Matric Scholarship. However, University Registration Fee and Examination Fee will be charged from such students if the university so desires. The eligibility of such students will be determined by a committee constituted by the College for this purpose which will be subject to the final approval of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, New Delhi for the release of scholarship.

An undertaking from such students will be required to the effect that they will remit the college fee immediately as and when the amount of post matric scholarship is transferred to their bank accounts. If any of students leaves the college during midsession, he/she will be bound the clear the college/university dues before leaving the college.

## FEE CONCESSION AT COLLEGE LEVEL

- Application for the concession on prescribed form obtainable from the college office should be submitted when called for.
- Fee concession, stipend, scholarship etc. will be withdrawn in case a scholar deteriorates in studies, remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of unfair means in any house test or examination.

Trakru, the Library was shifted to the present building in 1996, with separate stack room and a well furnished reading room having more than 150 chairs.

### Collection

The College Library has a very rich collection of books on all subjects being taught in the College at Intermediate, Graduate and Post-Graduate Level. More than 36600 titles are available. Encyclopaedias, Dictionaries, Year Books, Pictorial Dictionaries, India and World's Who's Who, Atlas, Thesaurus, books on Word Power etc. are available. Collected works of Mahatma Gandhi in 75 volumes is the unique part of Library Collection. Number of Hindi / Punjabi / English dailies, subject based Magazines and Journals also form a valuable component of the Library Collection.

### Facilities

- **Book-Bank Facility:** To facilitate the meritorious and needy students, college library provides free books from Book-Bank section. This section contains books as per the latest syllabus.
- **E-Catalogue :** Library books have been catalogued using most advanced system. E-Catalogue helps the students and Library Staff to check the availability of the books with its pre allocated location.
- **Internet Facility :** Library is equipped with fast speed Internet facility to facilitate the use of World Wide Web and to provide Online access to E-Books, E-Journals and other study material.
- **INFLIBNET :** INFLIBNET (Information & Library Network) The college is also a part of the INFLIBNET programme of UGC. The college library provides access to the E-resources to its members through N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET. Faculty members and students have been provided Login IDs and Passwords for accessing e-resources through N-LIST.
- **Library Reading Room :** The College Library has a reading room measuring 70\*30 sq ft. area for the use of students in their vacant periods.
- **Circulation Counter :** Issue and Return of books is done in an effective and speedy manner.
- **Future Plans :** The College plans to extend the timings of reading room and make available the facility of Reading Hall during holidays. Air-Conditioning of the Central Library and the reading room are the future plans to facilitate library readers.
