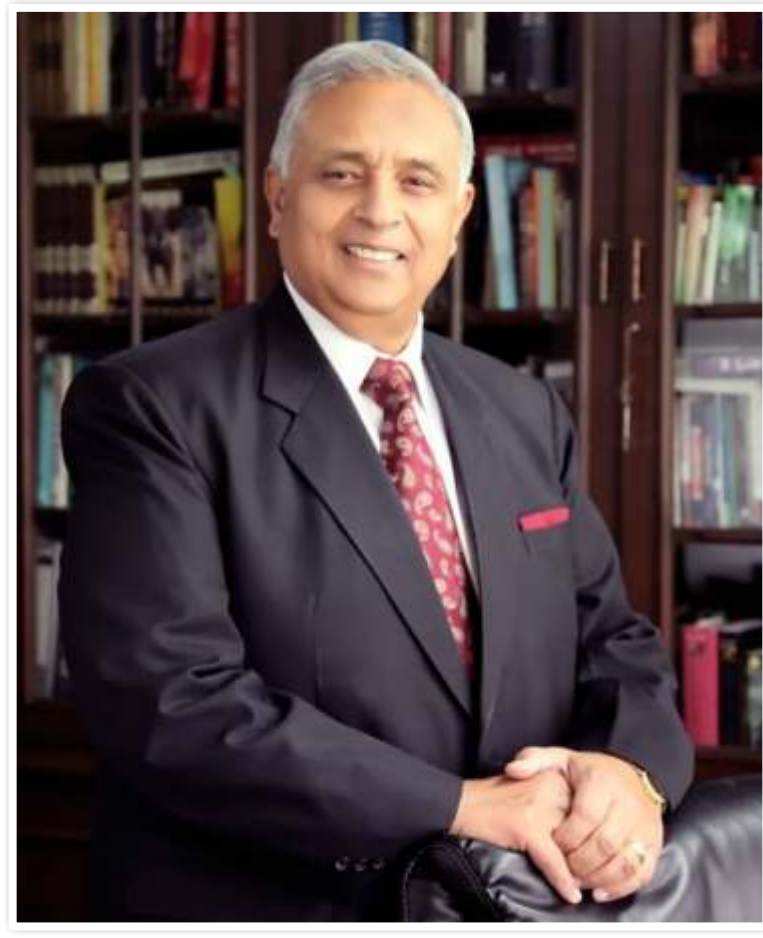


TEN PRINCIPLES OF ARYA SAMAJ

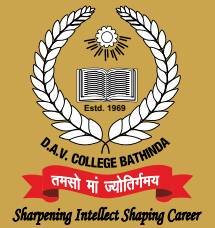

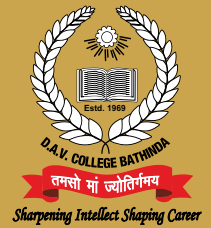

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING THE ADMISSION FORM



1. Read carefully the instructions given in the prospectus and the admission form.
2. Fill the admission form in your own handwriting, get it signed by parents/guardian.
3. The parents/guardian must read the rules and regulations before putting signature on the form.
4. Attach following documents with admission form
 - i) Passport size photographs = two (1 is to be pasted on admission form, 1 to be stapled)
 - ii) 1 Stamp size photograph (to be pasted on ID card)
 - iii) Character Certificate from institution last attended (not required for old students)
 - iv) Self-attested copy of last exam passed.
5. Students from any other University/Board are required to furnish the original detailed marks certificate of previous examination passed.
6. Candidates passing +2 from board other than P.S.E.B., C.B.S.E., Himachal Pradesh Board of Education, Haryana Board of Education, I.C.S.E., must produce eligibility certificate from registration branch of Punjabi University, Patiala before seeking admission in any undergraduate course.
7. Attach self-attested copies of reserve category certificate, if any.
8. If admission is granted, deposit the fees at appropriate fee counter on the same day.
9. **Students are required to fill subjects of their respective course in the form. If university changes any subject during the session, students have to opt accordingly.**

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- ❖ Students of B.A.I are allowed to change combination of subjects within a period of one month from the date of admission by paying Rs. 50/- .
- ❖ No candidate for B.A.I examination (under new scheme +3) shall take up the subject of Mathematics if he has not opted for this subject in +2 examination.
- ❖ Candidate who has passed the examination of Punjabi Parbodh from Languages Department Punjab will be considered equivalent to Matric Punjabi & will be eligible for the concerned course if he/she fulfills the rest of the conditions.

Punjabi Mudla Gyan in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory shall be allowed to the following categories of Candidates

- ➔ Candidates who have passed their matriculation examination from a school located outside the state of Punjab or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.
- ➔ Candidates who have passed their matriculation examination from a school located in the state of Punjab will not be allowed to take up the subject of Punjabi Mudla Gyan in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory at the Graduation level.
- ➔ Wards of Defence personnel / Para Military personnel (Serving as well as retired) will be allowed to take up the subject of Punjabi Mudla Gyan, provided the father or the mother / guardian (in case father is deceased) of the candidate gives an affidavit that the candidate has not studied Punjabi at the school level.

As per instructions of Punjabi University vide its letter No. 5163-5308/G.C.-6, dt. 13-05-08, all students of B.A., B.Com. & B.Sc. shall have to study Punjabi in their respective degree courses.

Multidisciplinary UG Programmes Offered by College in Accordance with National Education Policy (NEP)-2020

Course Objective

After completing the course a student can appear in any competitive exam, pursue for higher studies or get placement in Banking, Insurance Sector, Teaching etc.

B.A. I & II

Eligibility

The candidate must have passed 10+2 examination of the School Education Board of Punjab, Haryana, H.P., C.B.S.E. or any other examination recognized by Punjabi University, Patiala as equivalent thereto.

Candidates passing +2 from boards other than P.S.E.B., i.e. C.B.S.E., Himachal Pradesh Board of Education, Haryana Board of Education, I.C.S.E., must produce eligibility certificate from registration branch of Punjabi University before seeking admission in any undergraduate course and also submit migration certificate.

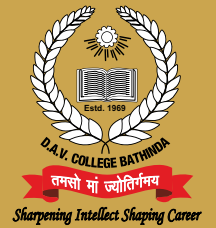

CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

1. Admissions for all graduate and post graduate classes & other courses shall be provisional subject to approval/confirmation of admission by Punjabi University. The College shall not be responsible if university does not approve admission of any student due to wrong or incomplete particulars submitted by him/her or for want of any requisite document. Therefore before filling in the form, the candidate must ensure that he/she is eligible for admission to a particular class. If any ineligibility is detected at any stage, the admission shall be cancelled and college shall not be responsible in any case.
2. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student whose behaviour was not found up to mark in the previous class.
3. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
4. The Principal can cancel the admission of any student who has been admitted to the college without assigning any reason whatsoever.
5. Students will keep their mobile phones on silent mode in campus and no mobile phone is allowed in campus during examination.

GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. Every candidate seeking admission to the college shall possess a copy of the College Prospectus including the Admission Form, available from the College Office on payment of Rs. 250/- (Rs. 275/- by Post)
2. Every Candidate must complete the admission form in all respects along with attested copies of supporting certificates and two passport size photographs.
3. Every student is required to produce in original the University/Board Certificate of having passed the previous examination and a character certificate from the institution last attended.
4. Any enhancement in fee and funds by the Punjabi University / Punjab Govt. / Managing Committee / College authorities at any stage shall be binding on the students of all classes. The proposed revised fee structure, if any, will be notified to the students.
5. All students coming on scooters/motorcycles shall have to pay motorcycle fee for the entire session. Any student found evading the payment of fee will be charged double the normal fee.
6. The security will be refunded in the month of November in the next session.
7. Security not withdrawn up to 30th June of the following session shall lapse automatically.

MOST IMPORTANT

1. Students from any other University/Board are required to furnish the original marks certificate of previous examination passed along with migration certificate in the college office for verification by the university within 15 days of getting admission.
2. Students passing their lower examination from other University/Board are required to obtain and produce eligibility certificate issued by Punjabi University, Patiala to get admission in the college.





ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

House Examination & Attendance for Undergraduate & Post Graduate Students

The Principal has right to detain the roll number of students according to university norms if he/she does not fulfil norms of attendance and marks in house tests.

Note : Under the Punjabi University Patiala regulations, students who do not fulfil the above conditions, cannot appear in the examination.

REFUND OF FEES

The Post Matric Scholarship (PMS) is provided to eligible SC students of all courses as per the following guidelines issued by the Govt. of Punjab.

- Minimum 75% attendance of student is compulsory.
- Annual income from all sources of parents/guardian should not exceed Rs.2.50 lac
- It is the sole responsibility of the student to apply for Post Matric Scholarship on dates given by Punjab Govt.
- In case a student fails to fulfill the eligibility conditions as laid down by the Government of Punjab, he/she will have to pay the complete fee as mentioned in the Prospectus.
- A scholarship holder under this scheme will not avail any other scholarship/stipend for pursuing the course.

Fee for SC students eligible for Post Matric Scholarship

The eligibility conditions will be applicable as per the guidelines issued by Department of Social Justice & Empowerment, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India in March 2021, and Punjabi University Endst. No. 2234-College/C/5 dated 25.4.2019 "If a SC student is found eligible for scholarship, the date for depositing the fee of such SC student may be extended till scholarship amount is transferred to his/her account. In all such cases, if so required, institution may take assurance from such students that they will deposit the fee to the institution as soon as they receive the scholarship amount in their accounts. Furthermore, it is reported that if some of the students have missed or failed to get admission because of delay in issue of these instructions, the Universities/Institutions may consider extending the date for admissions". The College has decided not to charge any fee from SC students eligible for Post Matric Scholarship. However, University Registration Fee and Examination Fee will be charged from such students if the university so desires. The eligibility of such students will be determined by a committee constituted by the College for this purpose which will be subject to the final approval of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, New Delhi for the release of scholarship. An undertaking from such students will be required to the effect that they will remit the college fee within 7 days after the amount of Post Matric Scholarship is transferred to their bank accounts. Students receive scholarship in two installments, 40% from the Govt. of Punjab and 60% from the Govt. of India. If any student leaves the college during midsession, he/she will be bound to clear the college/university dues before leaving the college.

On the other hand, this facility can also be accessed from the student's email account directly on the personal computer by selecting the Google-Classroom app from its menu (placed at the top right corner of the web browser). For Teachers: For organized form of the e-contents, all departments have been assigned a separate platform (classroom), which is further divided into topics on the name of teachers of that department. A teacher can invite (add) or remove any number of teachers and students in the department. For this the, teacher has to send an invitation from the respective gmail account. The contents contributed by a teacher will be shown under his/her name in the department if while uploading he/she select the topic as required name. To create the index of uploaded contents on this portal, each department has been provided topic 'Index for Teachers' at the top in Classwork. Teachers are requested to fill it for keeping the record and quick access of the uploaded contents.

Benefits: It enables students to download and revise the teaching material related to their courses. At the same time, it facilitates teachers for assigning paperless assignments, review and mark the assignments quickly. Additionally, it enhances communications between teachers and students. Students can share resources with one another, or provide answers to questions on this portal. It is affordable for all students as it is available free of cost and contains no advertisements. Google never uses the contents and student's data for advertising purposes. It is secure as it keeps the record of each activity deleted and uploaded files on it. LIBRARY

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Library of DAV College Bathinda was established in 1969 along with the inception of the college. Late Shri D. P. Bansal, the first librarian of the institution, played a significant role in developing the library into a vibrant centre of learning and academic excellence. Owing to the growing academic needs of students and faculty, the library was shifted to its present spacious building in 1996 during the tenure of Principal Shri P. L. Trakru.

The present library building houses a separate stack room along with a well-furnished and spacious reading hall capable of accommodating more than 150 students at a time. Over the years, the library has evolved into an important academic resource centre that supports teaching, learning, and research activities within the institution.

COLLECTION

The College Library possesses a rich and diversified collection of academic resources catering to the needs of Intermediate, Undergraduate, and Postgraduate students as well as faculty members. The total holdings of the library exceed 50,304 resources, which include approximately 39,128 books and 11,152 reference books covering a wide range of subjects taught in the college.

In addition to books, the library subscribes to 18 magazines and 6 journals related to academics, literature, and current affairs. The reference section contains encyclopedias, dictionaries, yearbooks, atlases, thesauruses, pictorial dictionaries, India and World Who's Who, and books related to communication skills and vocabulary enhancement.

One of the most prestigious possessions of the library is the *Collected Works of Mahatma Gandhi* comprising 75 volumes. The library also provides access to leading Hindi, Punjabi, and English newspapers along with subject-oriented journals and magazines, thereby fostering an enriching academic atmosphere for students and researchers.

FACILITIES

- **Book Bank Facility** : The library operates a Book Bank scheme to assist meritorious and economically weaker students by providing textbooks free of cost according to the latest university syllabus. This initiative ensures that deserving students have access to essential study material throughout the academic session.
- **E-Catalogue** : The library has been fully computerized with an advanced cataloguing and library management system. The e-catalogue enables students and faculty members to search, identify, and locate books quickly and efficiently.
- **Internet Facility**: High-speed internet connectivity is available within the library premises, enabling users to access online educational resources, e-books, e-journals, research databases, and other digital learning materials.
- **INFLIBNET Access** : The library provides access to digital academic resources through the N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET, which is presently being transitioned to ONOS (One Nation One Subscription). Faculty members and students are provided login credentials to access a vast collection of e-books, e-journals, and research publications.
- **Air-Conditioned Reading Hall** : The library houses a spacious and air-conditioned reading hall where students can study in a peaceful and comfortable environment during free periods as well as examination days.
- **Circulation Services** : The issue and return of books are managed through a fully automated circulation counter supported by Library Management Software. Most library operations and services have been computerized to ensure efficient, accurate, and user-friendly services for students and staff members.
- **Future Plans** : The college continuously strives to enhance library infrastructure and services in order to meet the evolving academic and technological needs of its users. Future plans include extending the reading room hours and keeping the reading hall open during holidays for the convenience of students. The institution also aims to further enrich the library collection with modern learning resources, digital databases, and advanced technological facilities to strengthen the culture of reading and research within the college.
